CAVEATS

Full-time tuition rates for undergraduates are for students who started at UIC in a given Fall term. Tuition rates are guaranteed for entering students for the next four years. UIC does not charge part-time students on a per credit hour basis. The reported rate is a range-rate tuition charge for 1-5 hours at UIC. Some students in undergraduate and graduate programs pay an additional tuition differential charge based on their academic program. The fees for full-time students (except Medicine and Dentistry) include a \$166 transportation fee for a Chicago transit pass. Medicine students pay a disability insurance fee of \$58.20. Referenced room and board charges are based on the standard double room rate and mid-range meal card plan. The application fee for international students is \$50.00.
