UIUC ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS

- During the past ten years, enrollments on the Urbana campus have remained stable. As Figure 1. illustrates, undergraduate enrollment continues to represent approximately 75 percent of total enrollment.
- 2. While the number of new students, as a percentage of total enrollment, has declined from 1979, the number of students who are being retained and are continuing their enrollment has increased, as indicated in Figure 2.
- 3. The diversity of the undergraduate population, as represented by racial/ethnic characteristics, has increased significantly during the past decade. As Figure 3. illustrates, the percentage of Asian/Pacific Islanders, Blacks, and Hispanics has risen dramatically.
- 4. Figures 4., 5., and 6. illustrate trends in enrollment by gender. Males continue to represent the majority of the undergraduate and graduate populations; however, the professional student cohort has changed from an approxmate 2:1 male to female ratio in 1979 to almost 1:1 in 1989.
- 5. The maps in Figures 7., 8., and 9. illustrate the geographical origin of the beginning freshmen, undergraduates, and graduate /professional populations. While the graduate/professional cohort represents a wider geographical distribution, the University continues to serve the State of Illinois by enrolling over 93 percent of the beginning freshman cohort who are residents of Illinois.



Change in UIUC Undergraduate Enrollments As a Percentage of Total Enrollment From Fall 1979 to Fall 1989



UIUC Undergraduate Minority Enrollment As a Percentage of Enrollment Fall 1979 - Fall 1989



UIUC Undergraduates By Gender As a Percentage of Enrollments Fall 1979 - Fall 1989



Fall 1979 - Fall 1989



Fall 1979 - Fall 1989







GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION OF BEGINNING FRESHMEN UIUC - FALL 1989





UIUC HIGHLIGHTS OF NEW STUDENT CHARACTERISTICS

- 1. When comparing fall 1979 with fall 1989 beginning freshman enrollments, the greatest decline occurred in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences which decreased by 17.3 percent. As Table 5.1 indicates, overall, beginning freshmen have decreased by 641 students (-10.9%).
- 2. New transfer enrollments have decreased by 27.5 percent from fall 1979 to fall 1989. Table 6.1 reports that only the College of Commerce and Business Administration enrolled more new transfer students in fall 1989 than in fall 1979.
- 3. UIUC continues to attract top high school graduates, as illustrated in Table 7 and Figure 10. A large percentage of each college's beginning freshman cohort were in the top 10% of their high school graduating class. Most notably, over 80 percent of the beginning freshmen entering the Colleges of Engineering and Commerce and Business Administration were in the top ten percent of their class.
- 4. The mean ACT Composite score for the fall 1989 beginning freshman cohort is 26.37. When comparing the percentage of freshmen with ACT:C scores of 27 or higher by college of entry, the Colleges of Commerce and Business Administration, Engineering, and Liberal Arts and Sciences enrolled over 50 percent of their freshman class with ACT:C scores in that range. (See Table 8 and Figure 11.)
- 5. Tables 9 and 10 present selected characteristics of the fall 1989 beginning freshman cohort and the new transfer cohort, including age, gender, racial/ethnic backgrounds, and institution of origin.

Percent of Fall 1989 Beginning Freshmen in the Top Ten Percent of H.S. Class by College of Entry at UIUC



Percent of Fall 1989 Beginning Freshmen with ACT:C Score of 27 or Higher by College of Entry



UIUC HIGHLIGHTS OF STUDENT ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

- The success rate for beginning freshmen being retained is highest for those students enrolled in the College of Commerce and Business Administration. After one year, 97 percent of this group was still enrolled on clear or probationary status. One year retention rates are reported in Table 11.
- 2. Table 12 tracks the mean grade point averages for community college transfers and four-year college transfers for six semesters after transfer. The community college transfer cohort dropped over one-half of a grade point the first semester but improved steadily in the three succeeding terms.
- 3. Graduation and retention patterns are reported in Tables 13 through 16 for beginning freshmen and transfers. The five-year graduation rate for freshmen ranges from 69 percent for the fall 1980 group to a high of 75 percent for the 1984 group. For transfers, the fall 1986 community college cohort had a 68 percent graduation rate after three years and the four-year group's rate was slightly higher at 71 percent.

Retention Rates for Beginning Freshmen One Year After Matriculation Fall 1988 Cohort



The above tables report enrollments and mean cumulative grade point averages for the fall 1986 cohort of new transfers to UIUC. This cohort was tracked for three years after transferring and represents the most recent cohort which has completed six semesters.

In fall 1986, 673 students from community colleges transferred to UIUC entering with a mean cumulative GPA of 4.28. After one semester, the mean GPA for this cohort dropped to 3.71. At the end of four semesters, or two years after transfer, the mean GPA for this cohort had increased to 3.97. Information regarding retention and graduation rates for this cohort are reported in Tables 15 and 16.

In fall 1986, 393 students from four-year colleges and universities transferred to UIUC entering with a mean cumulative GPA of 4.20. At the end of one semester, this cohort's mean GPA dropped to 3.94, a smaller decrease than experienced by the two-year cohort. At the end of four semesters, or two years after transfer, the mean GPA for this cohort increased to 4.08. Information regarding retention and graduation rates for this cohort are also reported in Tables 15 and 16.

Table 13 reports the percentage of beginning freshmen from fall 1980 to fall 1987 who have graduated. In fall 1980, 5,859 students enrolled as beginning freshmen and eight years later, 4,391 or 75 percent of those freshmen had received their baccalaureate degrees. The highest five year graduation rate is reported for the fall 1984 beginning freshman cohort with a 75 percent graduation rate. According to these data, the graduation rate continues to increase slightly with each new freshman class.

Table 14 reports retention patterns for beginning freshmen enrolled from fall 1980 to fall 1987. Retention percentages include students who have graduated or are still enrolled. For example, of those freshmen who entered UIUC in fall 1980, 75.8 percent have graduated or are still enrolled. Of the 5,619 students who enrolled as freshmen in 1987, 91.6 percent are still enrolled or have graduated. Similar to the graduation rates reported in Table 13, the retention rate appears to improve with each new beginning freshman cohort.

The above table reports cumulative graduation rates for community college and four-year transfers who matriculated to UIUC in fall 1986. This cohort was tracked for three years after transferring and represents the most recent cohort which has completed six semesters.

In fall 1986, 673 new students transferred from community colleges to UIUC. Of that initial cohort, 456 transfers graduated after six semesters representing a graduation rate of 68 percent. From four-year colleges, 393 new students transferred to UIUC. A slightly higher percentage of students in this cohort than the community college cohort graduated. Of the 393 four-year transfers, 281 (71%) graduated or were still enrolled after three years. Graduation rates for these two cohorts are similar to those reported for beginning freshmen in Table 13.

The above table reports retention rates for community college and four-year transfers who matriculated to UIUC in fall 1986. This cohort was tracked for three years after transferring and represents the most recent cohort which has completed six semesters. Retention rates represent the proportion of the initial cohort who has graduated or is still enrolled.

In fall 1986, 673 new students transferred from community colleges to UIUC. Of that initial cohort, 509 transfers graduated or were still enrolled after six semesters. From four-year colleges, 393 new students transferred to UIUC. A slightly higher percentage of students in this cohort than the community college cohort graduated or remained enrolled. Of the 393 four-year transfers, 310 (79%) graduated or were still enrolled after three years. Graduation rates for these two cohorts are reported in Table 15.

Degrees Conferred UIUC

UIUC HIGHLIGHTS OF DEGREES CONFERRED

- 1. In FY1989, the campus conferred 654 more degrees (+7%) than in FY1984. The two professional programs, law and veterinary medicine, conferred fewer degrees in FY1989 than in FY1984. (Table 34)
- 2. According to the data presented in Table 18, only the Colleges of Agriculture and Commerce and Business Administration conferred substantially fewer degrees in FY1989 than in FY1984. The College of Agriculture conferred 100 fewer bachelor's degrees and the College of Commerce and Business Administration conferred 197 fewer. Other undergraduate colleges remained approximately the same or increased.
- 3. When comparing degrees conferred by gender, from FY1984 to FY1989, the campus has changed from a 58 percent male and 42 percent female composition to a 53 percent male and 47 percent female composition. The most notable disparity between degrees conferred for males and females is in the College of Engineering; however, this reflects the proportion of males to females enrolled in that College. (Table 19)

EXPLANATORY NOTES FOR CHICAGO STUDENT DATA

In 1986, the Health Center campus and the University Center campus merged. To provide consistency in reporting enrollment data, figures for 1979 through 1986 have been adjusted to reflect this merger and report enrollments for the combined campuses.

In 1984, UIC initiated a Pharmacy Doctorate program at the professional level. Students in this program had formerly been included in the undergraduate pharmacy enrollment totals. Due to this change in classification, students entering the Pharmacy Doctorate program from 1984 through 1986 were subtracted from the undergraduate enrollment totals reported in the Enrollment Tables produced by the University Office of School and College Relations. This will explain increases in the Professional enrollments from 1984 through 1986.

Beginning in 1982, the Dentistry Post-Professional students were included among the Professional enrollments rather than with the Resident enrollments. To achieve consistency in reporting, students enrolled in the Dentistry Post-Professional program prior to 1982 have been included in the Professional category.

Enrollment data for UIC is based on two sources: 1) the Student Data Book which is produced by the Office of Planning and Resources Management at UIC and 2) the Enrollment Tables produced by the University Office of School and College Relations. The data was consistent in almost all instances; however, when discrepancies occurred, enrollment figures reported in the Enrollment Tables were used.

Enrollments UIC

UIC ENROLLMENT HIGHLIGHTS

- During the past ten years, enrollments on the Chicago campus have decreased slightly. As Figure 13. illustrates, graduate and professional enrollment has increased since fall 1979 while undergraduate enrollment has declined.
- 2. While the number of new students, as a percentage of total enrollment, has declined from 1979, the number of students who are being retained and are continuing their enrollment has increased by over 3 percent, as indicated in Figure 14.
- 3. The undergraduate cohort is represented by a more diverse racial/ethnic population in fall 1989 compared to fall 1979. As Figure 15. illustrates, the percentage of Asian/Pacific Islanders and Hispanics has risen while the percentage of Blacks has dropped to a level similar to the Hispanic cohort.
- 4. Figures 16., 17., and 18. illustrate trends in enrollment by gender. The proportion of males and females is almost equal at the undergraduate and graduate levels. The professional cohort has changed from an approximate 80 percent male and 20 percent female proportion in 1979 to 62 percent male and 38 percent female enrollment in 1989.
- 5. The maps in Figures 7. and 8. illustrate the geographical origin of the beginning freshmen and graduate/professional populations. While the graduate/professional cohort represents a wider geographical distribution, the University continues to serve the State of Illinois by enrolling over 98 percent of the beginning freshman cohort who are residents of Illinois.

UIC Fall Enrollments Fall 1979 - Fall 1989



Change in UIC Undergraduate Enrollments As a Percentage of Total Enrollment From Fall 1979 to 1989



UIC Undergraduate Minority Enrollment As a Percentage of Total Enrollment Fall 1979 - Fall 1989



Fall 1979 - Fall 1989






UIC Graduate Students By Gender

Fall 1979 - Fall 1989




GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION OF BEGINNING FRESHMEN UIC - FALL 1989

UIC HIGHLIGHTS OF NEW STUDENT CHARACTERISTICS

- 1. When comparing fall 1979 with fall 1989 beginning freshman enrollments, the largest decreases occurred in the College of Engineering (-48.5%) and the College of Business Administration (-34.6%). Beginning in 1983, the College of Education no longer enrolled beginning freshmen. As Table 24.1 indicates, overall, beginning freshmen have decreased by 630 students (-19.8%).
- 2. New transfer enrollments have decreased by 15.7 percent from fall 1979 to fall 1989. Table 25.1 reports that only the Colleges of Business Administration and Health, Physical Education, and Recreation enrolled more new transfer students in fall 1989 than in fall 1979.
- 3. A larger percentage of the beginning freshmen enrolling at UIC in the fall 1989 term than in the fall 1979 term, graduated in the upper quartile of their high school class, as illustrated in Table 26 and Figure 21. Consequently, the mean HSPR for the beginning freshman cohort has increased steadily over the past ten years.
- 4. The mean ACT Composite score for the fall 1989 beginning freshman cohort is 20.80, an increase of over 2 points when compared to the 1979 mean ACT:C score of 18.07. When comparing the percentage of freshmen with ACT:C scores of 18 or higher in 1979 and 1989, over 18 percent more of the 1989 beginning freshmen received a composite score of 18 or higher. (See Table 27 and Figure 22.)
- 5. Tables 28 and 29 present selected characteristics of the fall 1989 beginning freshman cohort and the new transfer cohort, including age, gender, racial/ethnic backgrounds, and institution of origin.

UIC BEGINNING FRESHMEN COMPARISON OF MEAN HSPR QUARTILES FALL 1979 and FALL 1989



UIC BEGINNING FRESHMEN COMPARISON OF ACT:C 1979 and 1989



Academic Performance UIC

UIC HIGHLIGHTS OF STUDENT ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

- 1. Graduation patterns for UIC beginning freshman cohorts are reported in Table 30. Five year graduation rates range from a low of 19 percent for the 1980 cohort to a high of 26 percent for the 1983 cohort.
- 2. Retention rates, reported in Table 31, include the number of students who have graduated plus those students who are still enrolled. Seven years after matriculating, 27.6 percent of the 1980 freshman cohort has graduated or is still enrolled. Rates for successive cohorts indicate a slight increase in the retention rates.
- 3. Graduation and retention rates for the fall 1984 transfer cohort are reported in Tables 32 and 33. Two years after enrolling, 6 percent of the community college transfers had graduated and 10 percent of the four-year college transfers had graduated. These rates are similar to the four-year graduation rates for beginning freshmen. Two years after enrolling, 42 percent of the community college cohort and 43 percent of the four-year cohort have been retained. These rates are slightly below the four-year retention rates for the fall 1984 beginning freshman cohort.

Table 30 reports the percentage of beginning freshmen from fall 1980 to fall 1987 who have graduated. In fall 1980, 3,173 students enrolled as beginning freshmen and eight years later, 831 or 26 percent of those freshmen had received their baccalaureate degrees. The highest five year graduation rate is reported for the fall 1983 beginning freshman cohort with a 26 percent graduation rate. According to these data, the graduation rate continues to increase slightly with each new freshman class.

Of the 2,282 students who enrolled as freshmen in 1987, 71.0 percent are still enrolled or have graduated. Similar to the graduation rates reported in Table 30, the retention rate appears to improve with each new beginning freshman cohort.

In fall 1984, 1,445 new students transferred from community colleges to UIC. Of that initial cohort, 86 transfers graduated after six quarters representing a graduation rate of 6 percent. From four-year colleges, 1,201 new students transferred to UIC. A slightly higher percentage of students in this cohort than the community college cohort graduated. Of the 1,201 four-year transfers, 120 (10%) graduated or were still enrolled after two years. Retention rates for these two cohorts are similar to those reported for beginning freshmen in Table 31.

Table 33 reports retention rates for community college and four-year transfers who matriculated to UIC in fall 1984. This cohort was tracked for two years after transferring and represents the most recent cohort which has been tracked. Retention rates represent the proportion of the initial cohort who has graduated or is still enrolled.

In fall 1984, 1,445 new students transferred from community colleges to UIC. Of that initial cohort, 604 transfers graduated or were still enrolled after six terms. From four-year colleges, 1,201 new students transferred to UIC. A slightly higher percentage of students in this cohort than the community college cohort graduated or remained enrolled. Of the 1,201 four-year transfers, 514 (43%) graduated or were still enrolled after two years. Graduation rates for these two cohorts are reported in Table 32.

Degrees Conferred UIC

UIC HIGHLIGHTS OF DEGREES CONFERRED


- 1. In FY1989, the campus conferred 4,605 degrees. This represents increases at the Master's, Doctorate, and Professional degree levels since FY1984. At the Bachelor's level, fewer degrees were conferred in FY1989 compared to fiscal years 1984 through 1987, but represents an increase over FY1988. (Table 34)
- According to the data presented in Table 35, only the Colleges
 of Education, Liberal Arts and Sciences, and Health, Physical
 Education and Recreation conferred more baccalaureate
 degrees in FY1989 than in FY1984. Other undergraduate
 colleges remained approximately the same or decreased.
 Pharmacy no longer confers baccalaureate degrees.
- 3. Table 36 reports degrees conferred by gender in FY1989. The overall percentage of males and females receiving degrees is almost equal with 49 percent of the degrees being conferred to males and 51 percent to females. The largest differences can be observed at the master's level (43% male and 57% female) and professional level (63% male and 37% female).
- 4. Table 36 also reports the number of degrees conferred by race/ethnic categories. Overall, 68 percent of the degrees conferred in FY1989 went to white students. The percentage for whites is slightly higher at the professional degree level. Foreign students received 13 percent of the master's degrees and 27 percent of the doctorates awarded in FY1989. Blacks and Hispanics each received 6 percent of the FY1989 degrees. They received a slightly higher percentage of the baccalaureate and doctoral degrees.

COMPARISON OF DEGREES CONFERRED DOCTORATE AND PROFESSIONAL FY 1984 AND FY 1989


