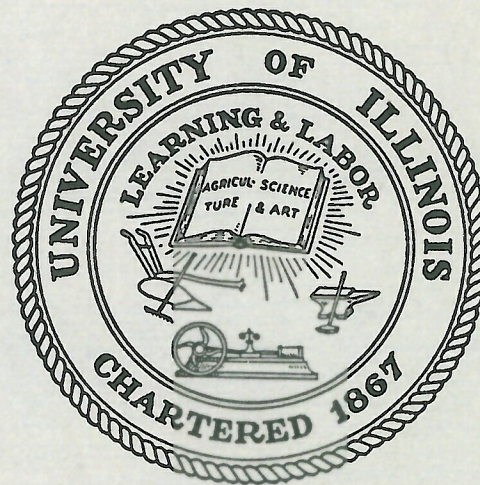

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EXPLANATORY NOTES FOR CHICAGO STUDENT DATA

In 1986, the Health Sciences Center campus and the University Center campus merged. To provide consistency in reporting enrollment data, figures for 1980 through 1986 have been adjusted to reflect this merger and report enrollments for the combined campuses.

In 1984, UIC initiated a Pharmacy Doctorate program at the professional level. Students in this program had formerly been included in the undergraduate pharmacy enrollment totals. Due to this change in classification, students entering the Pharmacy Doctorate Program from 1984 through 1986 were subtracted from the undergraduate enrollment totals reported in the Enrollment Tables produced by the University Office of School and College Relations. This will explain increases in the Professional enrollments from 1984 through 1986.

Beginning in 1982, the Dentistry Post-Professional students were included among the Professional enrollments rather than with the Resident enrollments. To achieve consistency in reporting, students enrolled in the Dentistry Post-Professional program prior to 1982 have been included in the Professional category.

Enrollment data for UIC is based on three sources: 1) the Student Data Book which is produced by the Office of Planning and Resources Management at UIC, 2) the Enrollment Tables produced by the University Office of School and College Relations, and 3) Integrated Post-Secondary Education Data System (IPEDS), reported by the University of Illinois to the Illinois Board of Higher Education. The data were consistent in almost all instances; however, when discrepancies occurred, enrollment figures reported in the Enrollment Tables were used.

HIGHLIGHTS

1. *During the past ten years, enrollments on the Chicago campus have decreased slightly. As Figure 1. illustrates, graduate and professional enrollments have increased since fall 1980. While undergraduate enrollment generally has decreased since 1980, fall 1990 represented the largest undergraduate enrollment since 1985.*
2. *While the number of new students, as a percentage of total enrollment, has declined from 1980, the number of students who are being retained and are continuing their enrollment has increased by almost 4 percent, as indicated in Table 2.1*
3. *When comparing fall 1980 and fall 1990 undergraduate enrollments, the Colleges of Education, Engineering, and Nursing experienced the largest decreases, as illustrated in Figure 3. Table 4 reports graduate enrollment by college. Overall, graduate enrollment increased by 9 percent in fall 1990 compared with fall 1986.*
4. *Figure 4. illustrates trends in undergraduate and graduate enrollments by gender. The proportion of males to females is almost equal at undergraduate and graduate levels. The professional cohort has changed from an approximate 80 percent male and 20 percent female proportion in 1980 to 57 percent male and 43 percent female enrollment in 1990.*
5. *The undergraduate cohort is represented by a more diverse racial/ethnic population in fall 1990 compared to fall 1980. As Figure 5. illustrates, the percentage of Asian/Pacific Islanders and Hispanics has risen while the percentage of Blacks has dropped to a level similar to the Hispanic cohort.*
6. *The maps in Figures 7., 8. and 9. illustrate the geographical origin of beginning freshmen, undergraduate and graduate/professional populations. While the graduate/professional cohort represents a wider geographical distribution, the University continues to serve the State of Illinois by enrolling over 97 percent of the beginning freshmen from Illinois.*

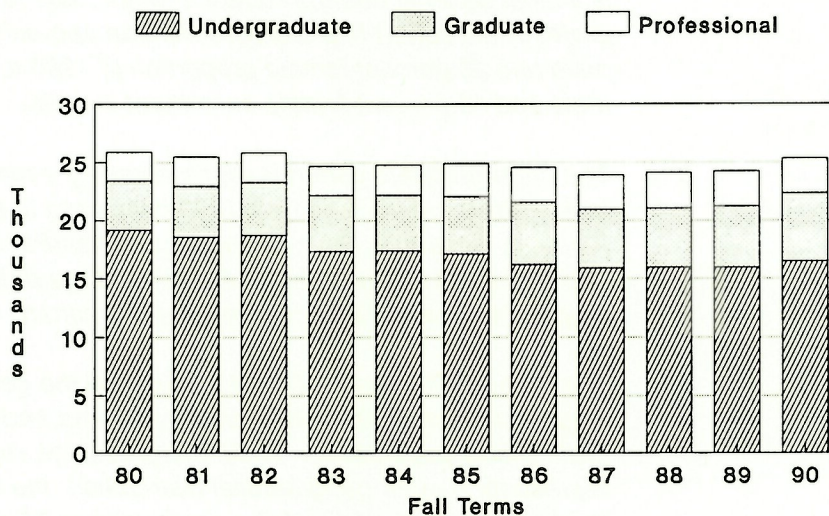

Fall 1980 - Fall 1990**

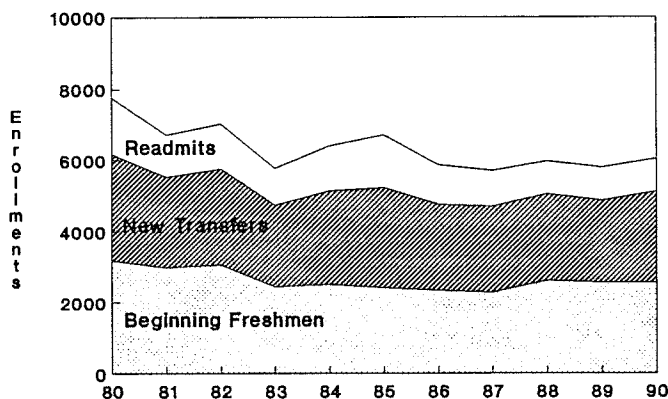

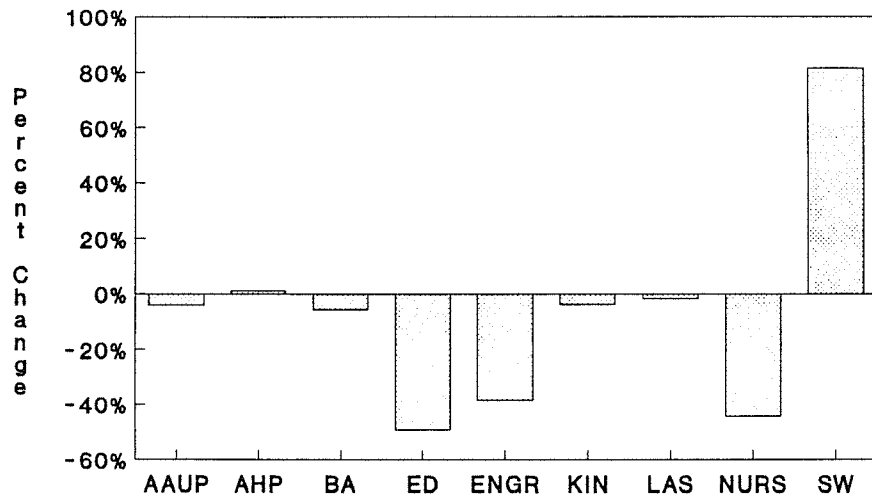

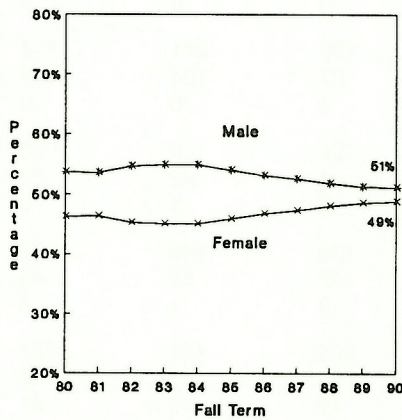

Fall 1980 - Fall 1990

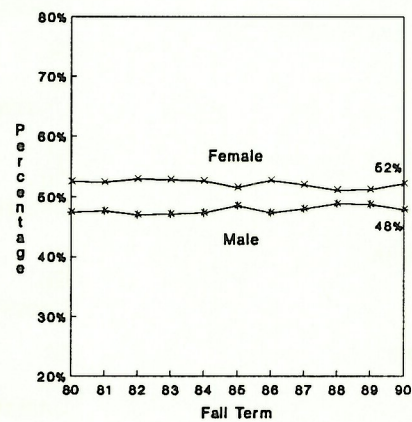

UIC Undergraduate Minority Enrollment As a Percentage of Enrollment Fall 1980 - Fall 1990

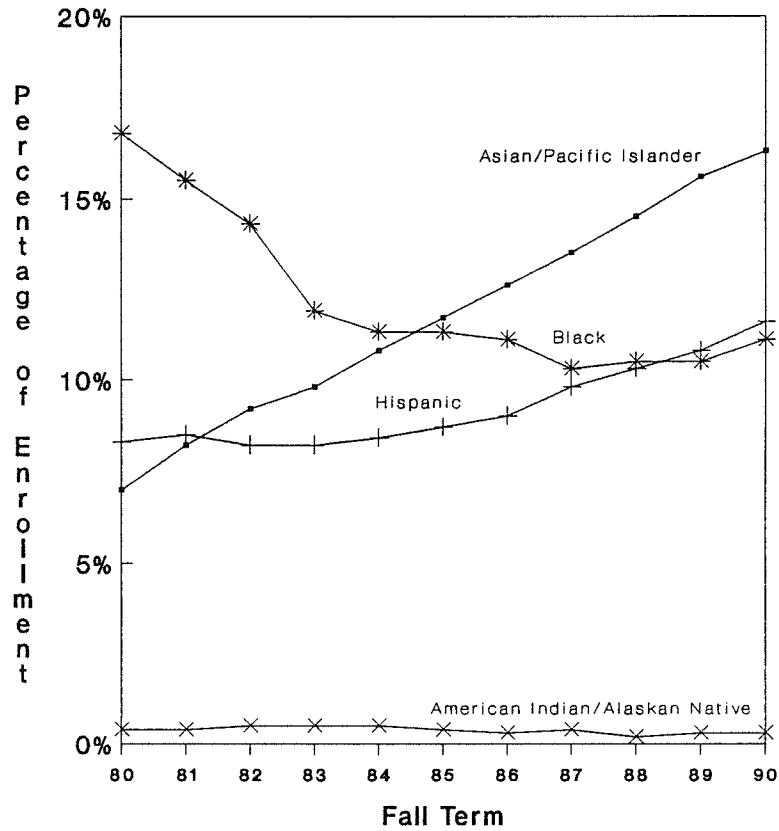

In 1985, the President's Award Program (PAP) was established under the leadership of the President of the University. Beginning fall 1991, the program will include American Indian/Alaskan Native students.

UIC Graduate Minority Enrollment As a Percentage of Enrollment Fall 1980 - Fall 1990

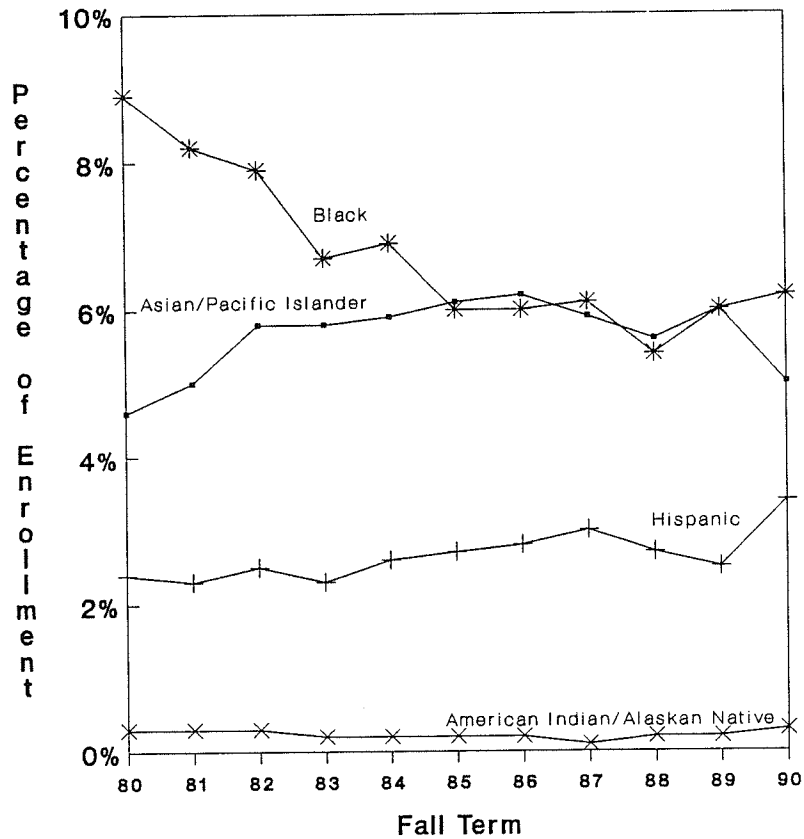

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION OF BEGINNING FRESHMEN UIC - FALL 1990

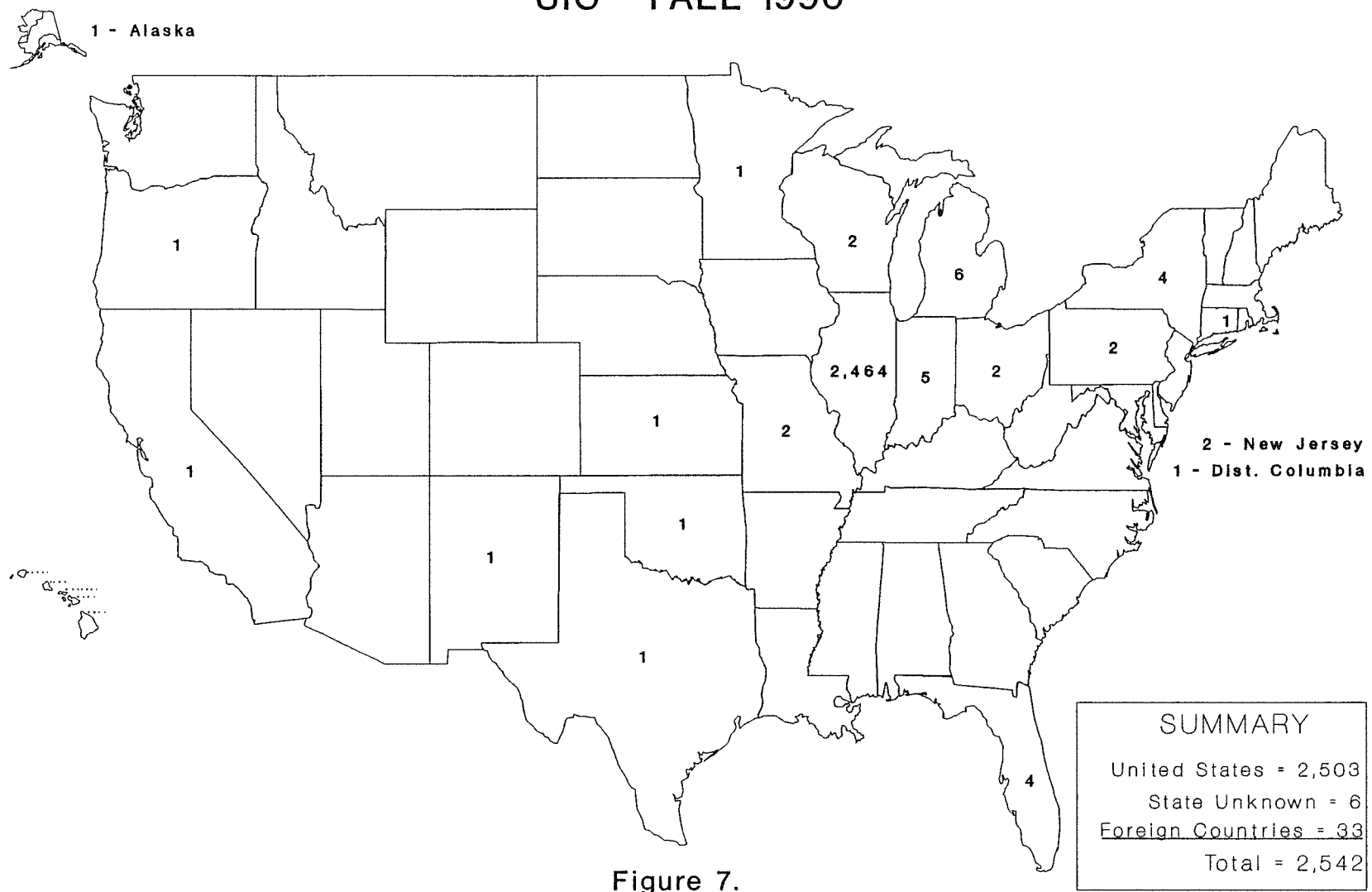

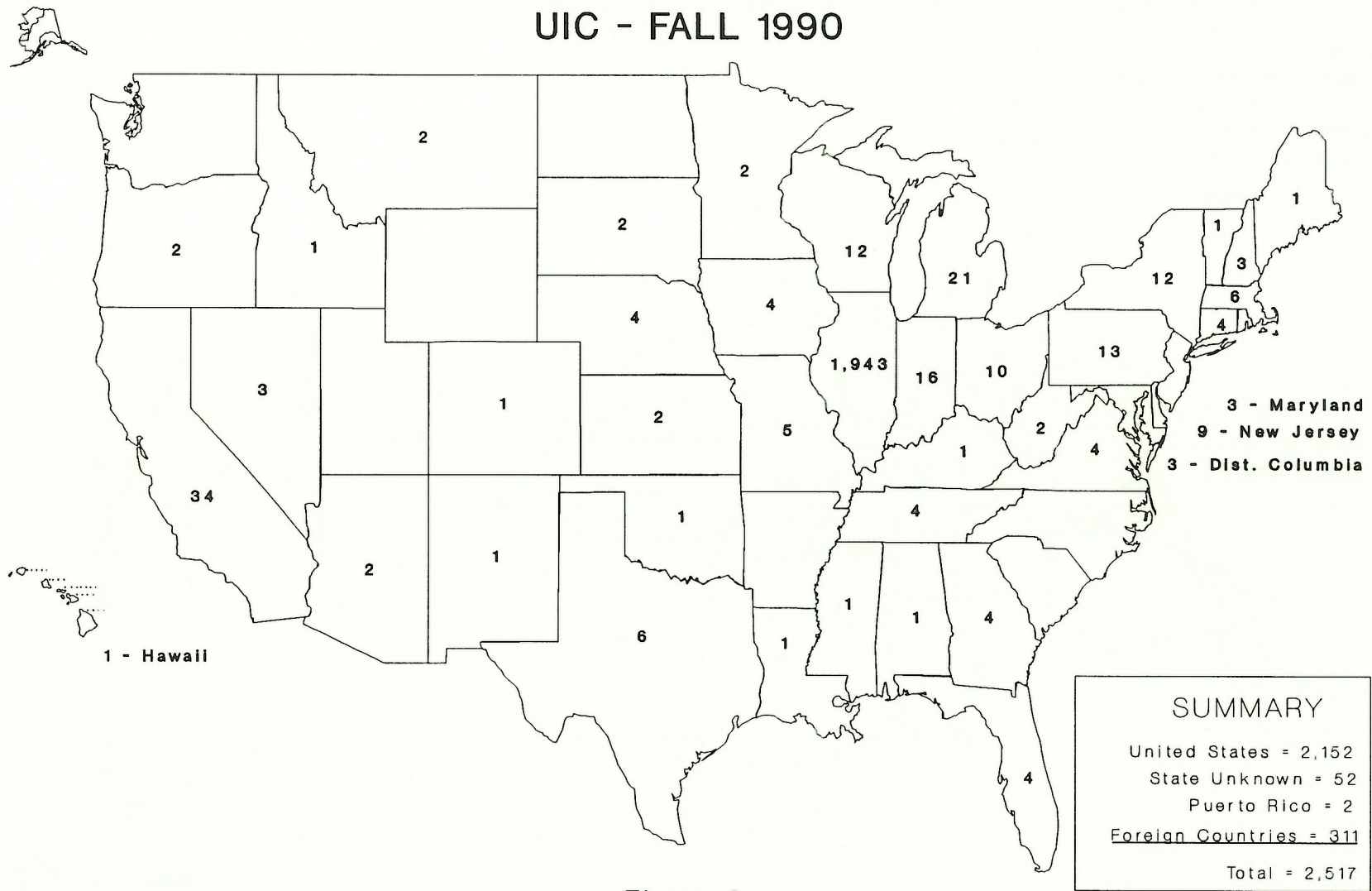
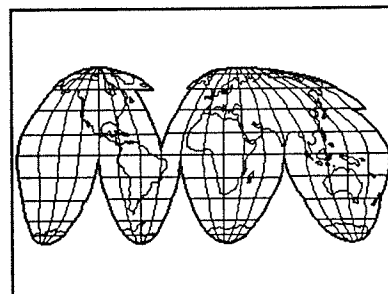

New Student Characteristics

UIC

HIGHLIGHTS

1. *When comparing fall 1980 with fall 1990 beginning freshman enrollments, the largest decreases occurred in the College of Engineering (-55.2%) and the College of Business Administration (-46.2%). As Table 10.1 indicates, overall, beginning freshmen have decreased by 585 students (-18.7%).*
2. *New transfer enrollments have decreased by 14.2 percent from fall 1980 to fall 1990. Table 11.1 reports that the Colleges of Business Administration, Kinesiology, Liberal Arts and Sciences and Social Work enrolled more new transfer students in fall 1990 than in fall 1980.*
3. *A larger percentage of the beginning freshmen enrolling at UIC in the fall 1990 term than in the fall 1980 term, graduated in the upper quartile of their high school class, as illustrated in Table 12 and Figure 10. Consequently, the mean HSPR for the beginning freshman cohort has increased steadily over the past ten years.*
4. *The mean ACT Composite score for the fall 1990 beginning freshman cohort increased over 1.5 points when compared to the 1980 mean ACT:C score of 18.04. When comparing the percentage of freshmen with ACT:C scores of 18 or higher in 1980 and 1990, over 13 percent more of the 1990 beginning freshmen received a composite score of 18 or higher. The UIC ACT:C average exceeded 20 for 7 of the last 11 years. (See Table 13 and Figure 11.)*
5. *Tables 14 and 15 present selected characteristics of the fall 1990 beginning freshman cohort and the new transfer cohort, including age, gender, racial/ethnic backgrounds, and institution of origin. Figure 12. displays beginning freshmen by county of origin and Figure 13. charts the district from which community college students transferred.*

 Fall 1980 and Fall 1990

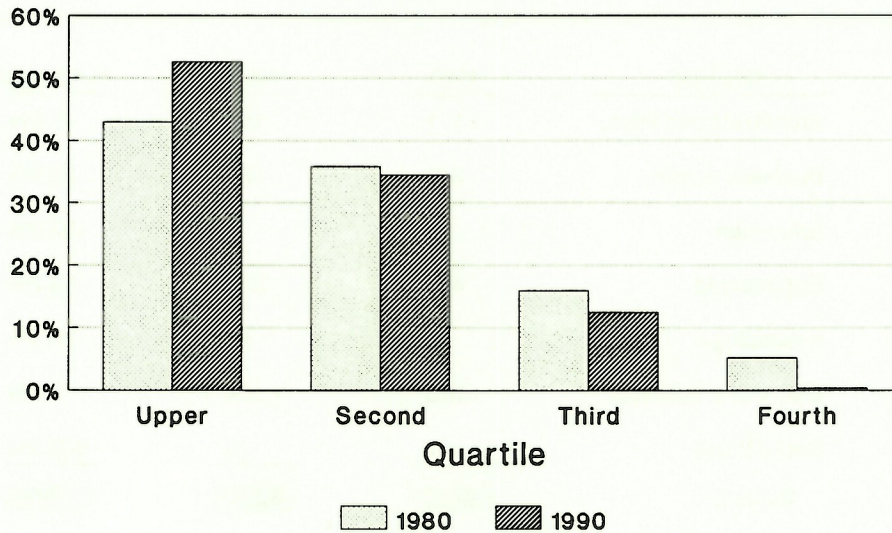

 Fall 1980 and Fall 1990

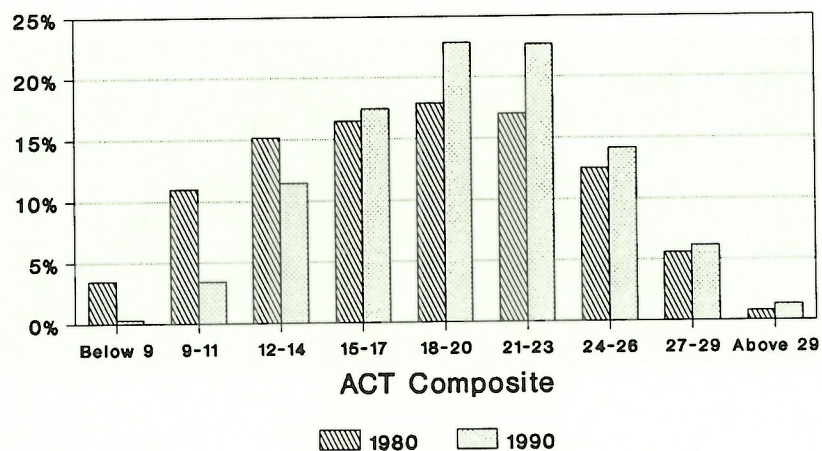

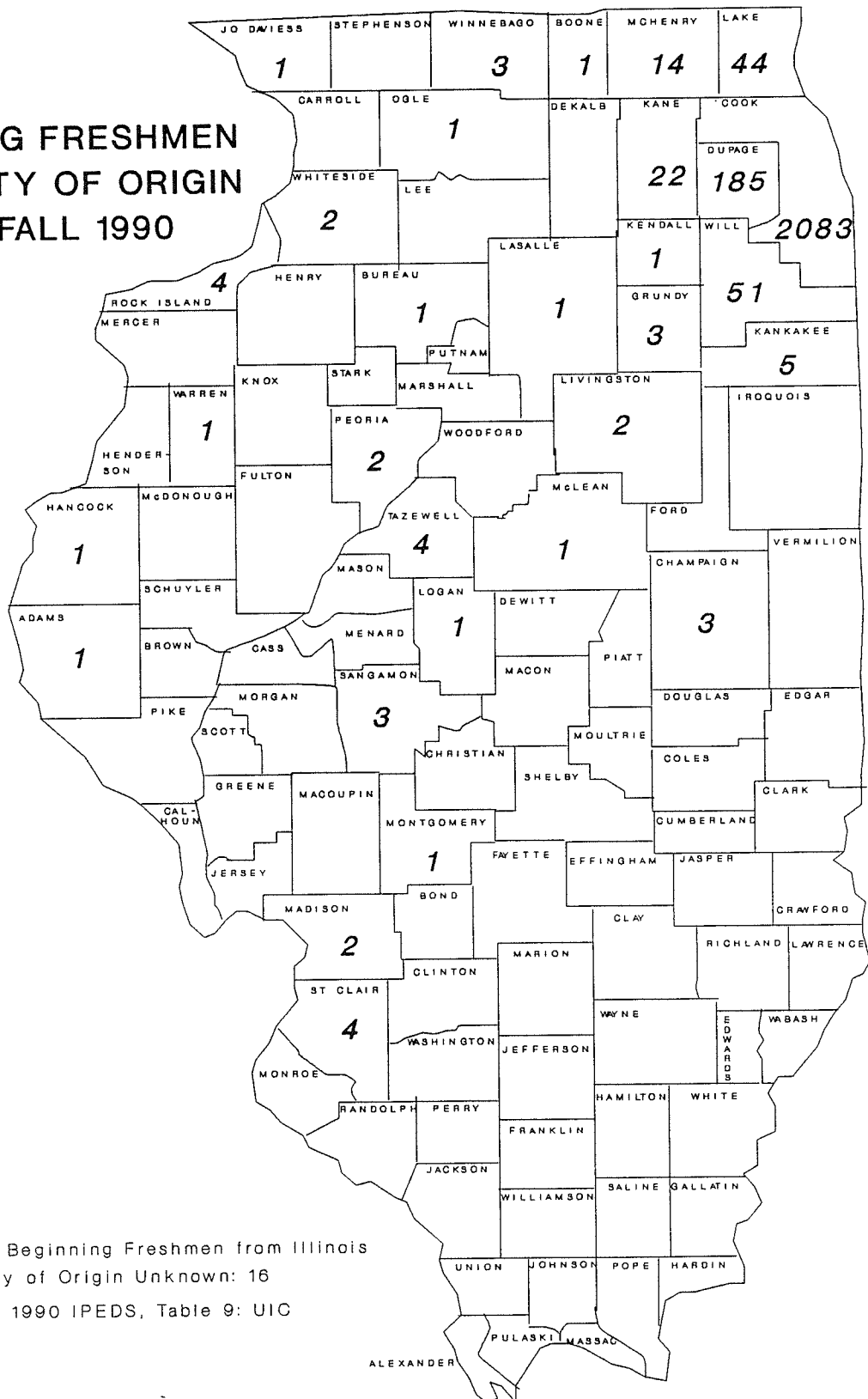

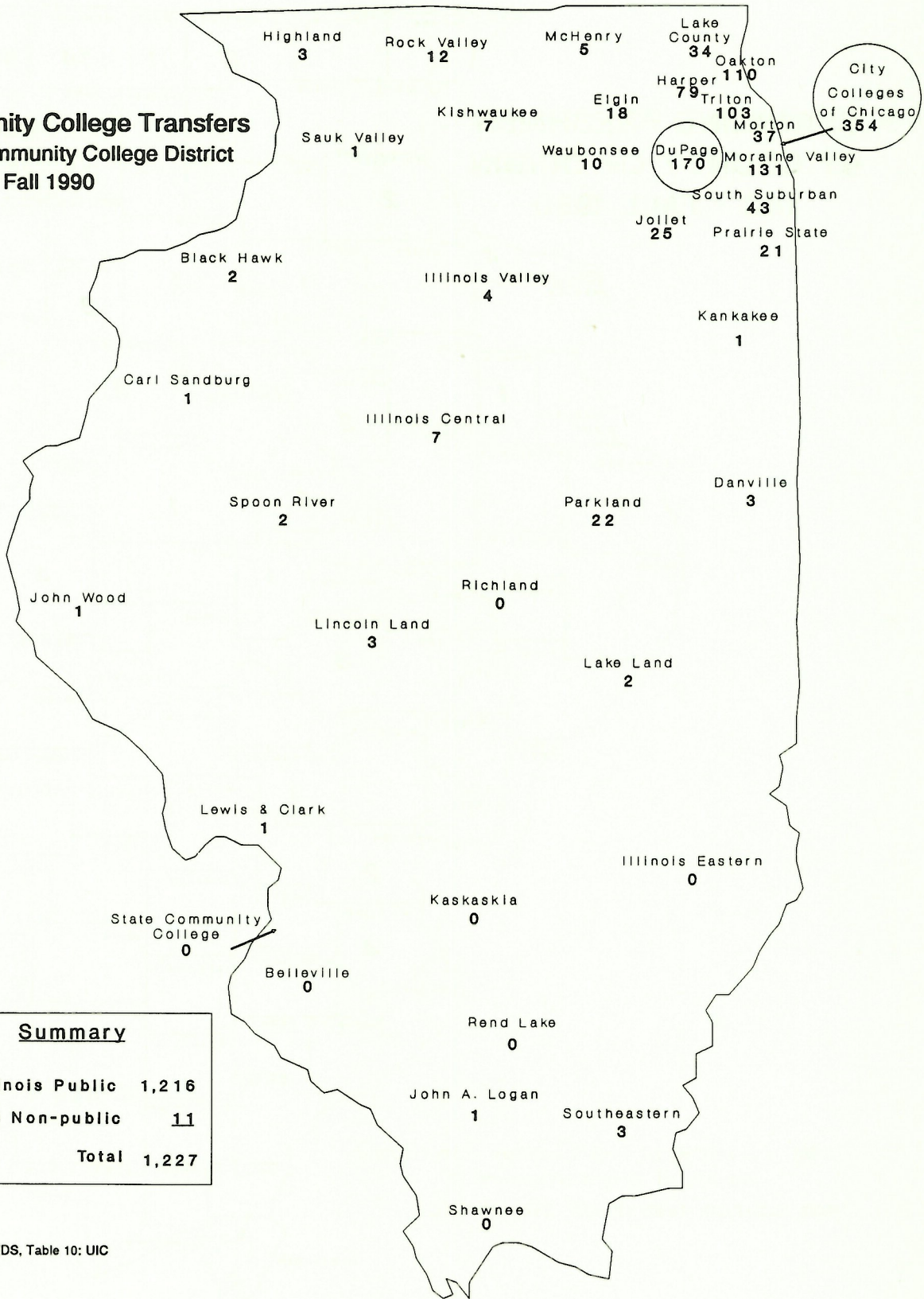
**BEGINNING FRESHMEN

Academic Performance

UIC

HIGHLIGHTS

1. *Graduation patterns for UIC beginning freshman cohorts are reported in Table 16. Five year graduation rates range from a low of 19 percent for the 1980 cohort to a high of 26 percent for the 1983 cohort.*
2. *Retention rates, reported in Table 17, include the number of students who have graduated plus those students who are still enrolled. Seven years after matriculating, 27.6 percent of the 1980 freshman cohort has graduated or is still enrolled. Rates for successive cohorts indicate a slight increase in the retention rates.*
3. *Graduation and retention rates for the fall 1984 transfer cohort are reported in Tables 18 and 19. Two years after enrolling, 6 percent of the community college transfers had graduated and 10 percent of the four-year college transfers had graduated. These rates are similar to the four-year graduation rates for beginning freshmen. Two years after enrolling, 42 percent of the community college cohort and 43 percent of the four-year cohort have been retained. These rates are slightly below the four-year retention rates for the fall 1984 beginning freshman cohort.*
4. *First time transfers who matriculated to UIC in fall 1980 were tracked for eight years following transfer. At the end of eight years, the cohort had a 33 percent graduation rate. Figure 14. illustrates the number of students who graduated, were no longer enrolled and those still enrolled at the end of eight years.*

Table 16 reports the percentage of beginning freshmen from fall 1980 to fall 1987 who have graduated. In fall 1980, 3,173 students enrolled as beginning freshmen and eight years later, 831 or 26 percent of those freshmen had received their baccalaureate degrees. The highest five year graduation rate is reported for the fall 1983 beginning freshman cohort with a 26 percent graduation rate. According to these data, the graduation rate continues to increase slightly with each new freshman class.

Table 17 reports retention patterns for beginning freshmen enrolled from fall 1980 to fall 1987. Retention percentages include students who have graduated or are still enrolled. For example, of those freshmen who entered UIC in fall 1980, 27.6 percent have graduated or are still enrolled through FY 1988. Of the 2,282 students who enrolled as freshmen in 1987, 71.0 percent are still enrolled or have graduated. Similar to the graduation rates reported in Table 16, the retention rate appears to improve with each new beginning freshman cohort.

Notes: Fall Beginning Freshmen include freshmen entering in the summer preceding the fall quarter. Fiscal Year is defined as July 1 of the previous year through June 30 of the year shown. Students were counted as enrolled if they enrolled any quarter during the fiscal year.

Table 18 reports cumulative graduation rates for community college and four-year transfers who matriculated to UIC in fall 1984. This cohort was tracked for two years after transferring and represents the most recent transfer cohort which has been tracked.

In fall 1984, 1,445 new students transferred from community colleges to UIC. Of that initial cohort, 86 transfers graduated after six quarters representing a graduation rate of 6 percent. From four-year colleges, 1,201 new students transferred to UIC. A slightly higher percentage of students in this cohort than the community college cohort graduated. Of the 1,201 four-year transfers, 120 (10%) graduated or were still enrolled after two years. Retention rates for these two cohorts are similar to those reported for beginning freshmen in Table 17.

Table 19 reports retention rates for community college and four-year transfers who matriculated to UIC in fall 1984. This cohort was tracked for two years after transferring and represents the most recent cohort which has been tracked. Retention rates represent the proportion of the initial cohort who has graduated or is still enrolled.

In fall 1984, 1,445 new students transferred from community colleges to UIC. Of that initial cohort, 604 transfers graduated or were still enrolled after six quarters. From four-year colleges, 1,201 new students transferred to UIC. A slightly higher percentage of students in this cohort than the community college cohort graduated or remained enrolled. Of the 1,201 four-year transfers, 514 (43%) graduated or were still enrolled after two years. Graduation rates for these two cohorts are reported in Table 18.

 Fall 1980 Transfer Cohort

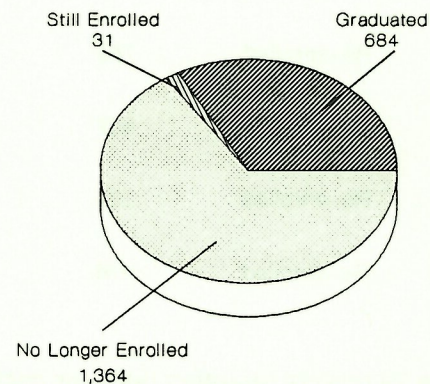

Table 20 reports cumulative graduation rates for first time transfers who matriculated to UIC in fall 1980. This cohort was tracked for eight years after transferring. In fall 1980, 2,079 new transfers entered UIC. Of the initial transfer cohort, 684 graduated after eight years representing a graduation rate of 33 percent. Of the 684 UIC graduates, the largest percentage (12%) graduated upon completion of their third year.

Degrees Conferred

UIC

HIGHLIGHTS

1. *In FY 1990, the campus conferred 4,383 degrees. This represents increases at the master's, doctorate, and professional degree levels since FY 1984. At the bachelor's level, fewer degrees were conferred in FY 1990 compared to fiscal years 1984 through 1989 (Table 21).*
2. *According to the data presented in Table 22, only the Colleges of Education, Liberal Arts and Sciences, and Social Work conferred more baccalaureate degrees in FY 1990 than in FY 1984. Other undergraduate colleges remained approximately the same or decreased. Pharmacy no longer confers baccalaureate degrees.*
3. *Table 23 reports degrees conferred by gender in FY 1990. The overall percentage of males and females receiving degrees is almost equal with 49 percent of the degrees being conferred to males and 51 percent to females. The largest differences can be observed at the doctorate level (61% male and 39% female) and professional level (63% male and 37% female).*
4. *Tables 24 and 24.1 report the number and percent of degrees conferred by race/ethnic categories. Overall, 67 percent of the degrees conferred in FY 1990 went to white students. The percentage for whites is slightly higher at the professional degree level. Foreign students received 13 percent of the master's degrees and 30 percent of the doctorates awarded in FY 1990. Black's, Hispanics and foreign students each received 6 percent of the FY 1990 degrees.*

 From FY 1984 to FY 1990

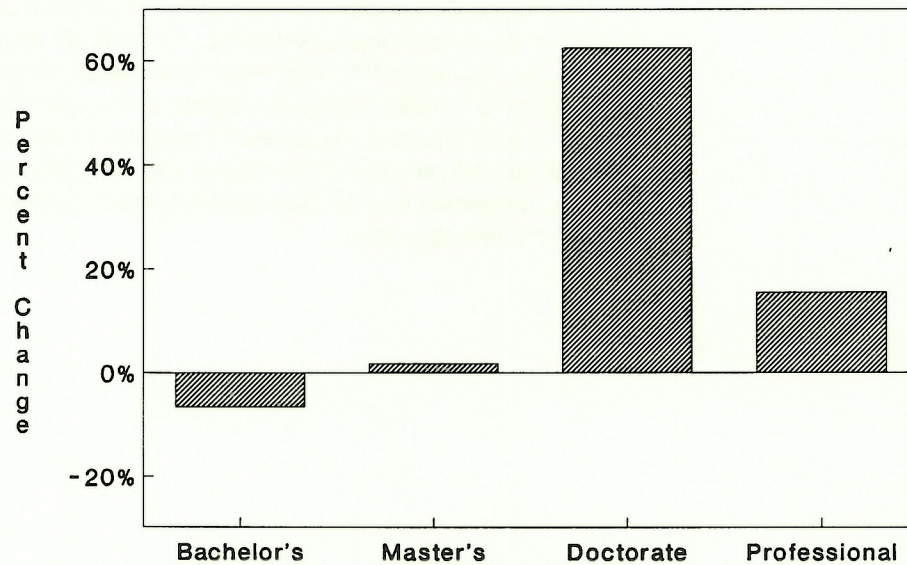

From FY 1984 to FY 1990

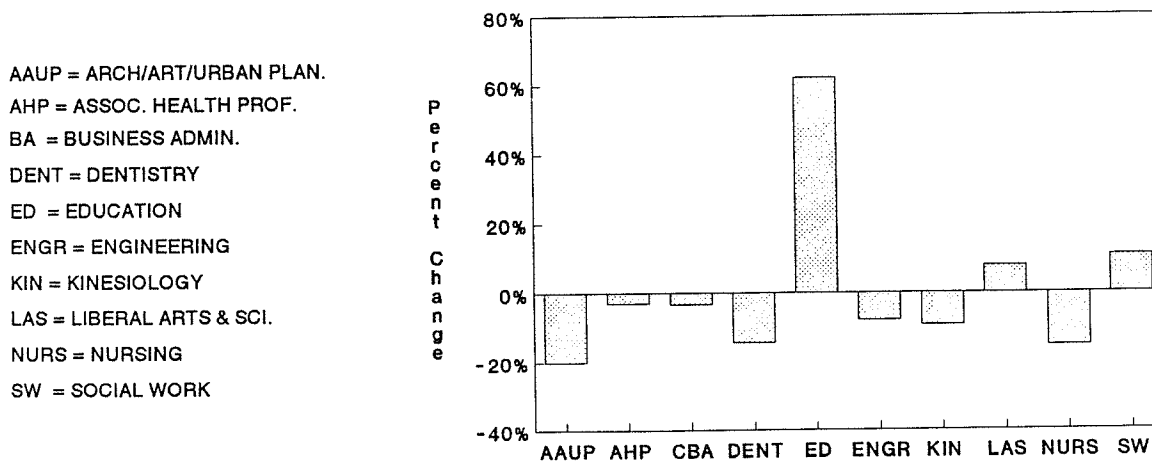

HIGHLIGHTS

1. *During the past ten years, enrollments on the Urbana campus have remained stable. As Figure 17. illustrates, undergraduate enrollment continues to represent approximately 75 percent of total enrollment.*
2. *As reported in Table 26, fall 1990 new student enrollments increased by 12 percent for beginning freshmen and 36 percent for new transfers over fall 1989 enrollments.*
3. *Enrollments by college are reported in Tables 27 and 28. As illustrated by Figure 19., fall 1990 undergraduate enrollments in Aviation, Communication, Education, and Liberal Arts and Sciences have increased when compared to fall 1980. The remaining undergraduate college enrollments have decreased. Figure 20. compares graduate enrollment by gender within colleges.*
4. *Figures 21., 22., and 23. illustrate trends in enrollment by gender. Males continue to represent the majority of the undergraduate and graduate populations; however, the professional student cohort has changed from an approximate 2:1 male to female ratio in 1980 to almost 1:1 in 1990.*
5. *The diversity of the undergraduate population, as represented by racial/ethnic characteristics, has increased significantly during the past decade. As Figure 24. illustrates, the percentage of Asian/Pacific Islanders, Blacks, and Hispanics continues to increase dramatically over fall 1980 minority enrollment levels.*
6. *The maps in figures 27., 28., and 29. illustrate the geographical origin of beginning freshmen, undergraduates, and graduate/professional populations. While the graduate/professional cohort represents a wider geographical distribution, over 91 percent of the beginning freshman cohort are Illinois residents.*

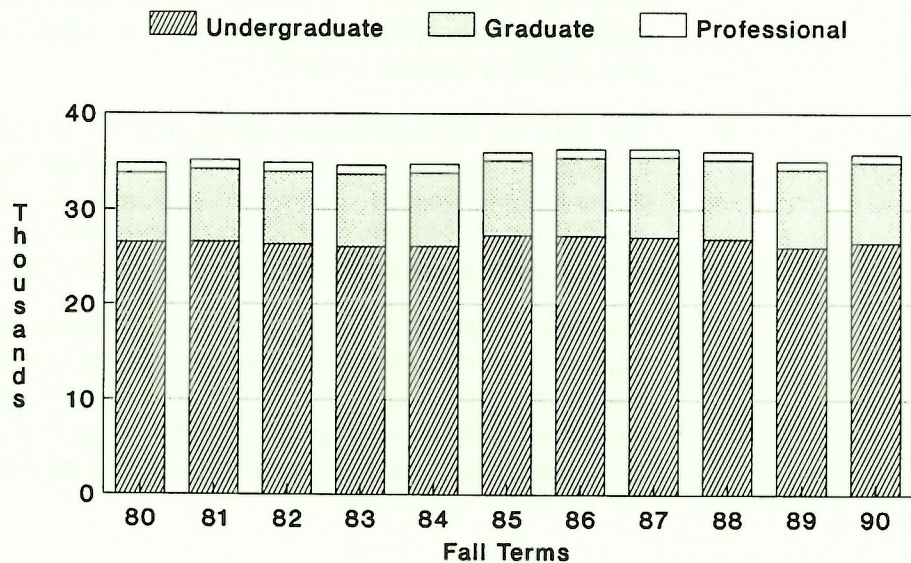

Fall 1980 to Fall 1990

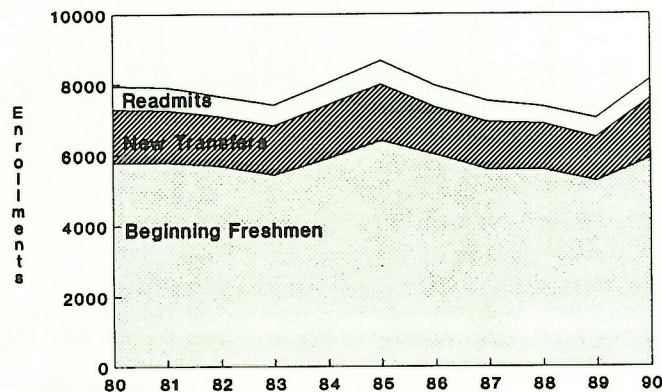

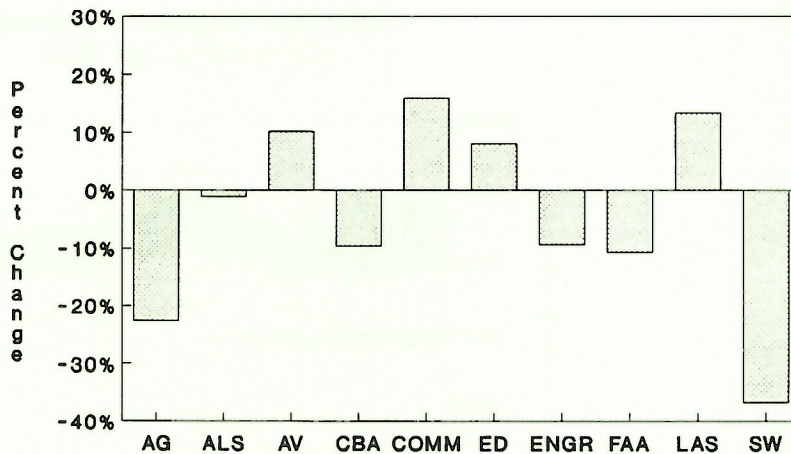

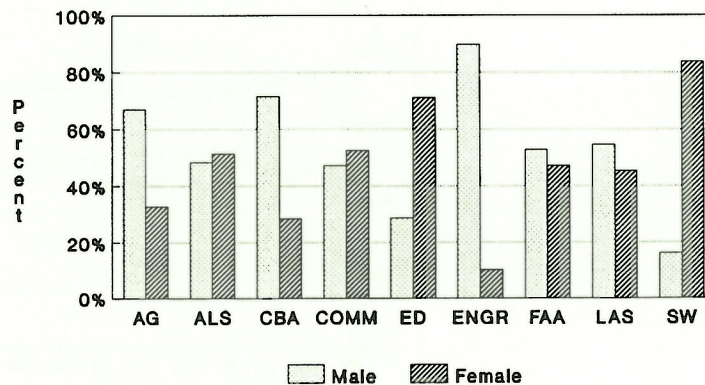

 Fall 1980 - Fall 1990

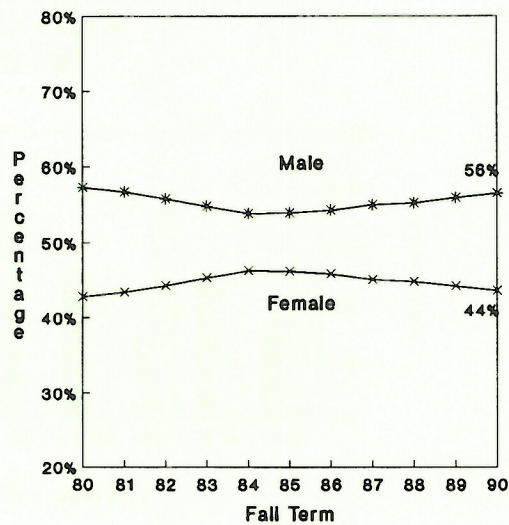

 Fall 1980 - Fall 1990

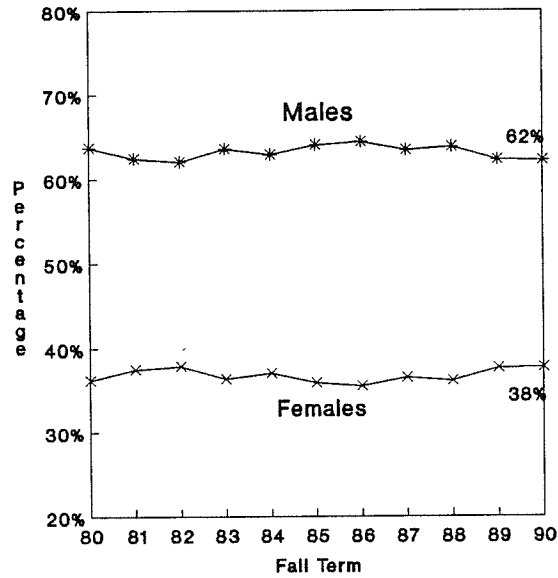

 Fall 1980 - Fall 1990

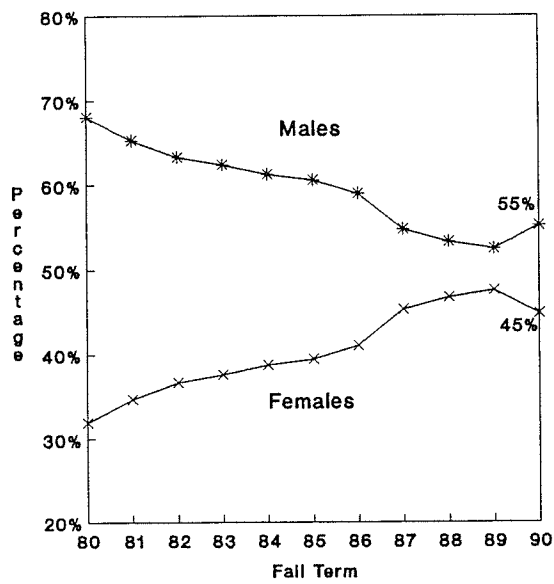

UIUC Undergraduate Minority Enrollments As a Percentage of Enrollment Fall 1980 - Fall 1990

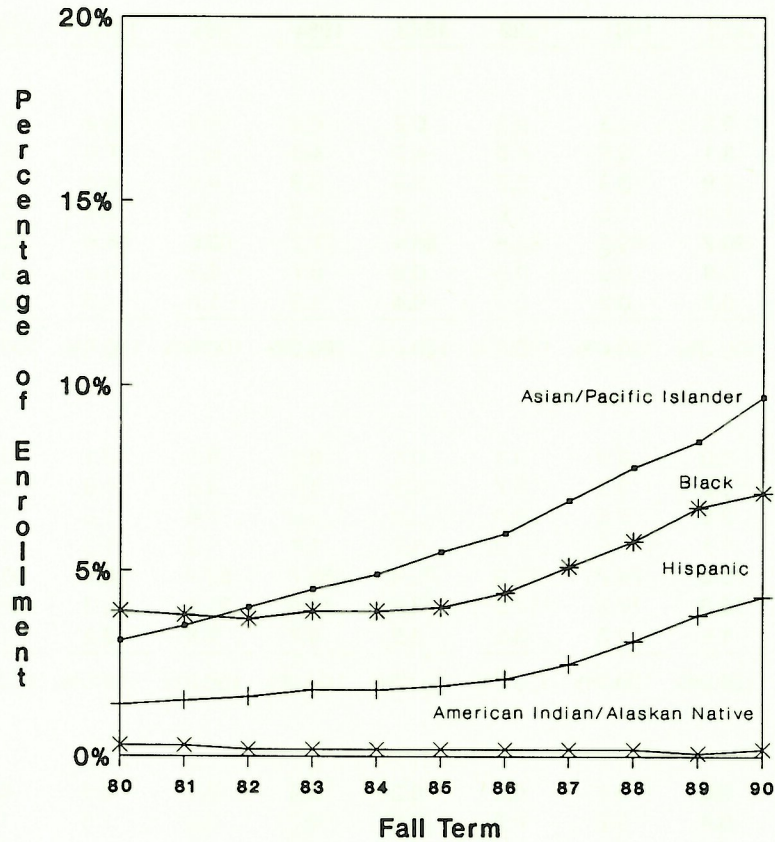

 Fall 1980 - Fall 1990

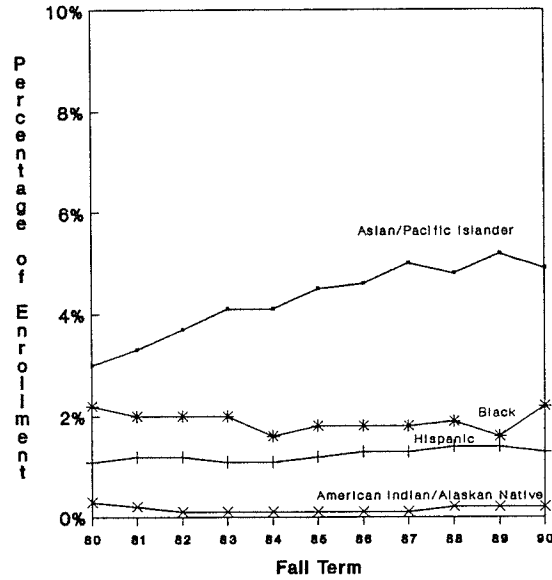

 Fall 1980 - Fall 1990

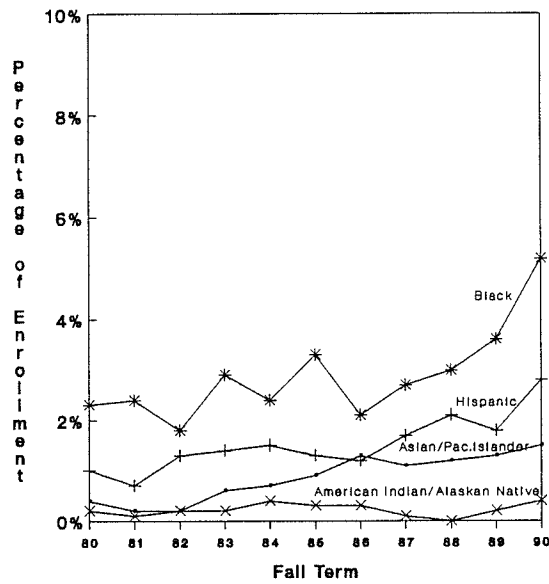

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION OF BEGINNING FRESHMEN UIUC - FALL 1990

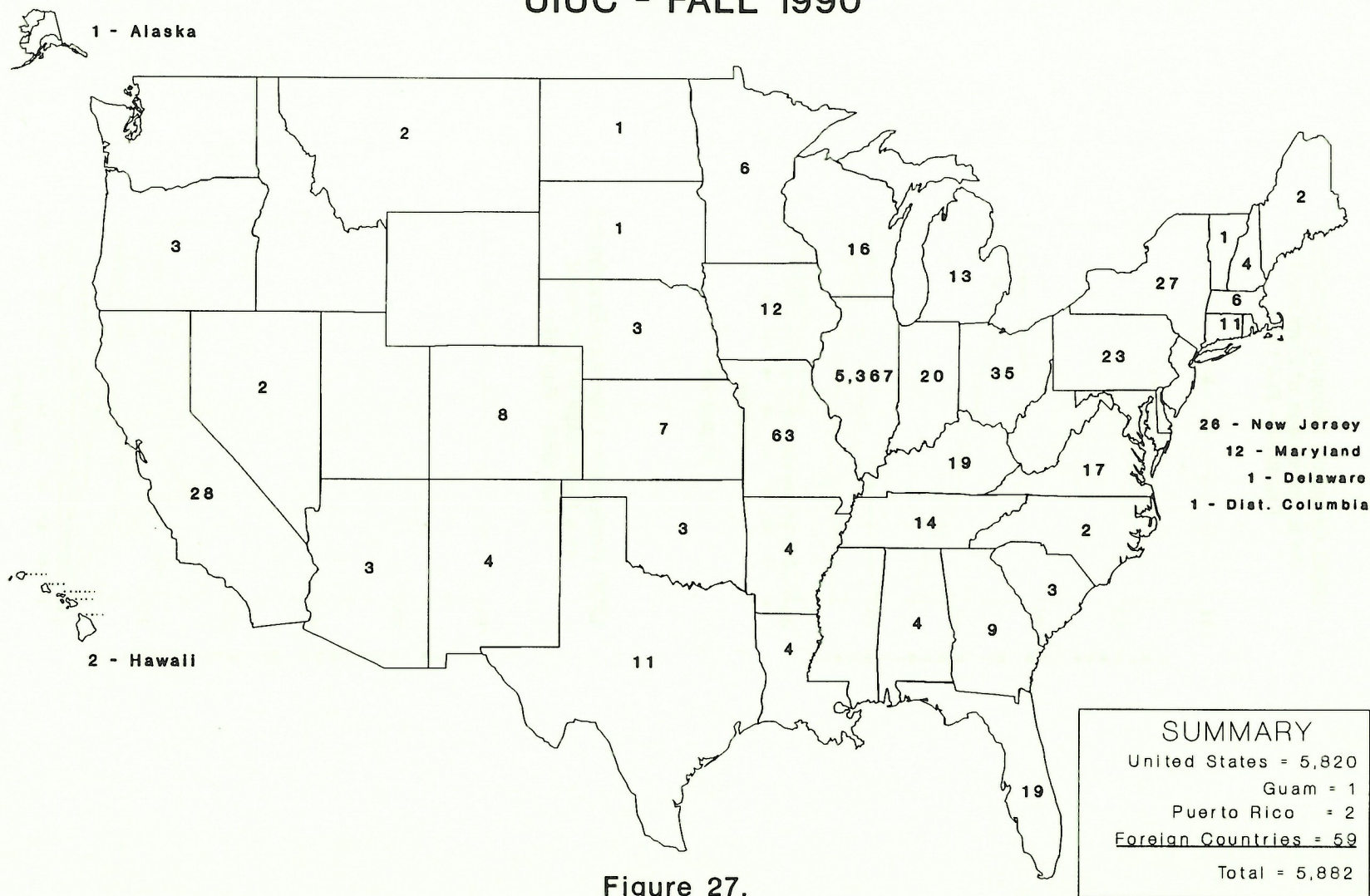

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION OF PROFESSIONAL AND GRADUATE STUDENTS UIUC - FALL 1990

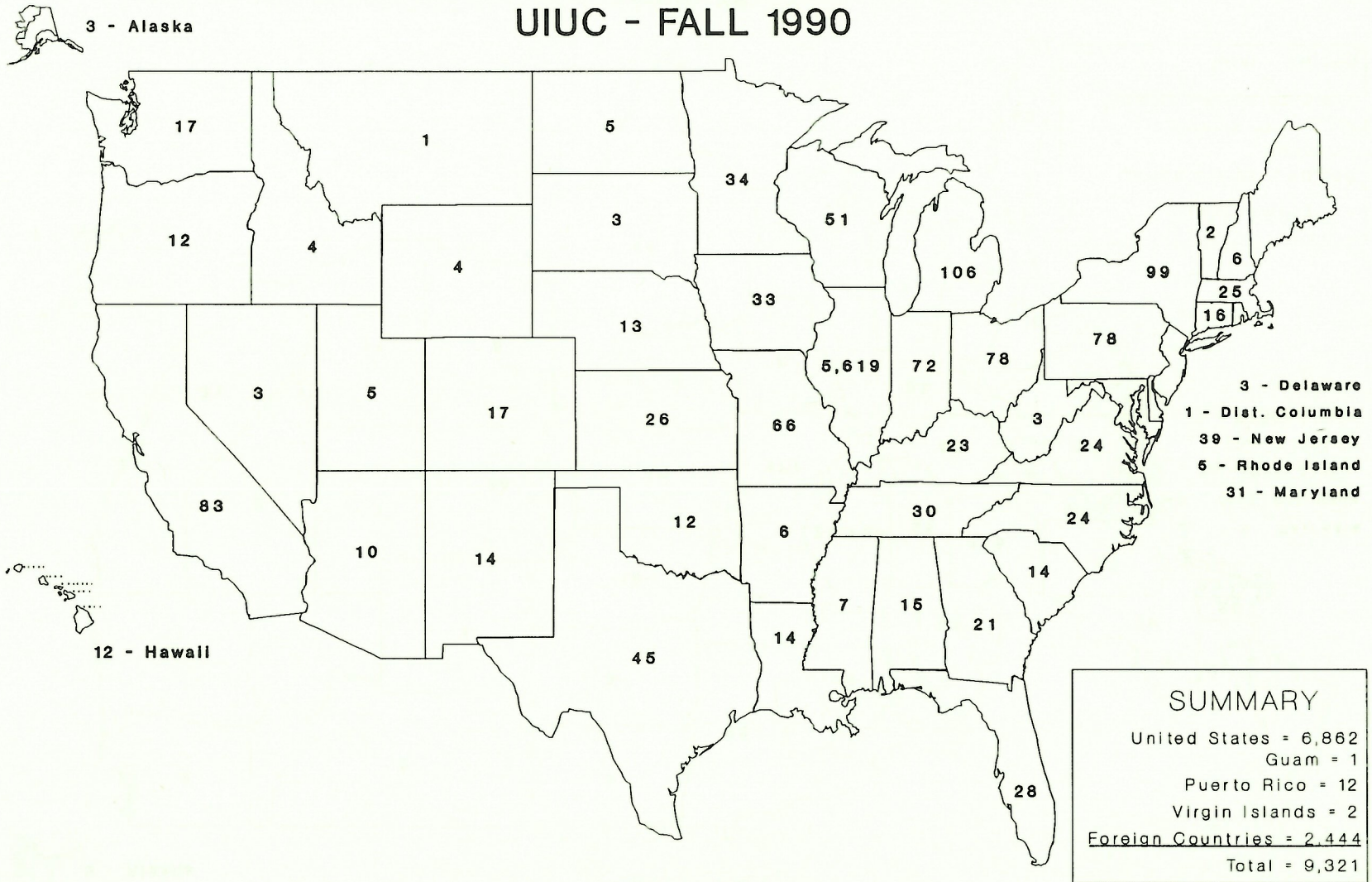
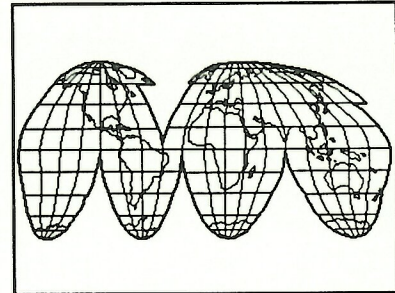

HIGHLIGHTS

1. *When comparing fall 1980 with fall 1990 beginning freshman enrollments, only the Colleges of Agriculture and Liberal Arts and Sciences have fewer beginning freshmen. As Table 33.1 reports, beginning freshmen increased by 1.6 percent over fall 1980 levels.*
2. *New transfer enrollments increased by 11.2 percent from fall 1980 to fall 1990, with increases occurring in the Colleges of Commerce and Business Administration, Liberal Arts and Sciences, and Social Work.*
3. *UIUC continues to attract top high school graduates, as illustrated in Tables 35 and 36. As a group, the fall 1990 class entered with a slightly lower mean high school rank and ACT composite score compared to the fall 1989 class.*
4. *Figure 32. reports the number of beginning freshmen by county of origin. Cook and the collar counties around Chicago provide the largest numbers of beginning freshmen to UIUC. Two downstate counties, Champaign and St. Clair, also are large feeder counties. Only two counties in Illinois did not send freshmen for the fall 1990 term, Gallatin and Alexander.*
5. *Figure 33. reports the number of new transfers by community college district. Parkland Community College and the College of DuPage are the two largest feeders to UIUC for the fall 1990 term.*

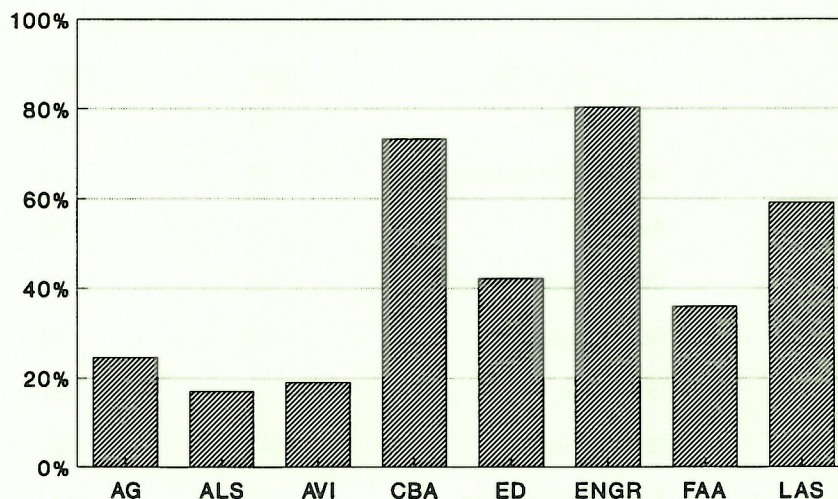

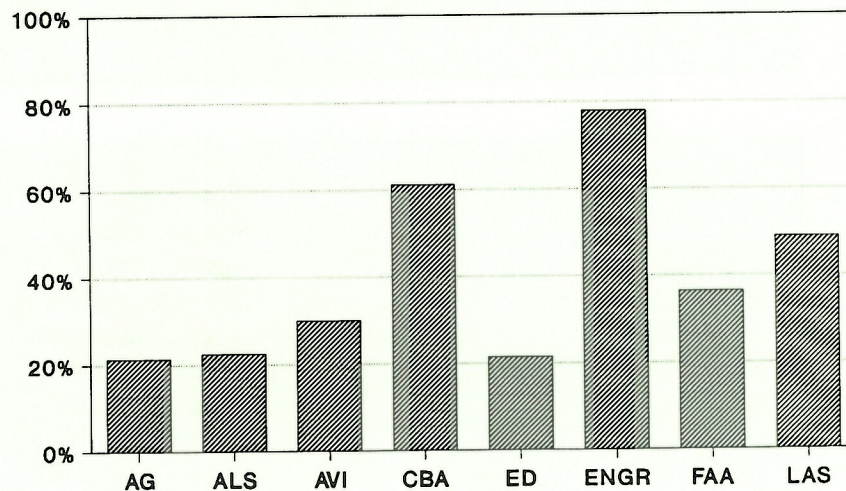

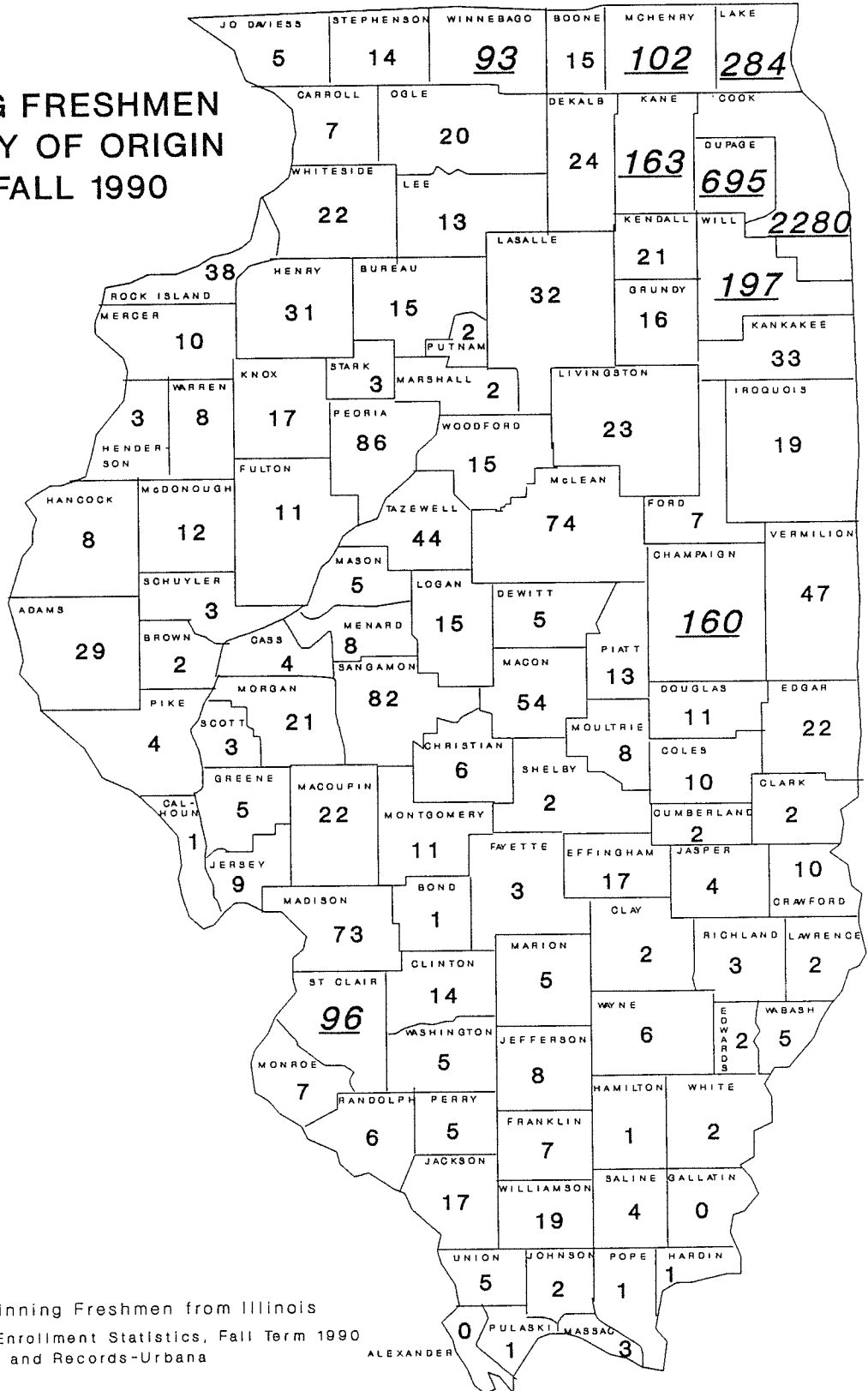

 Fall 1990**

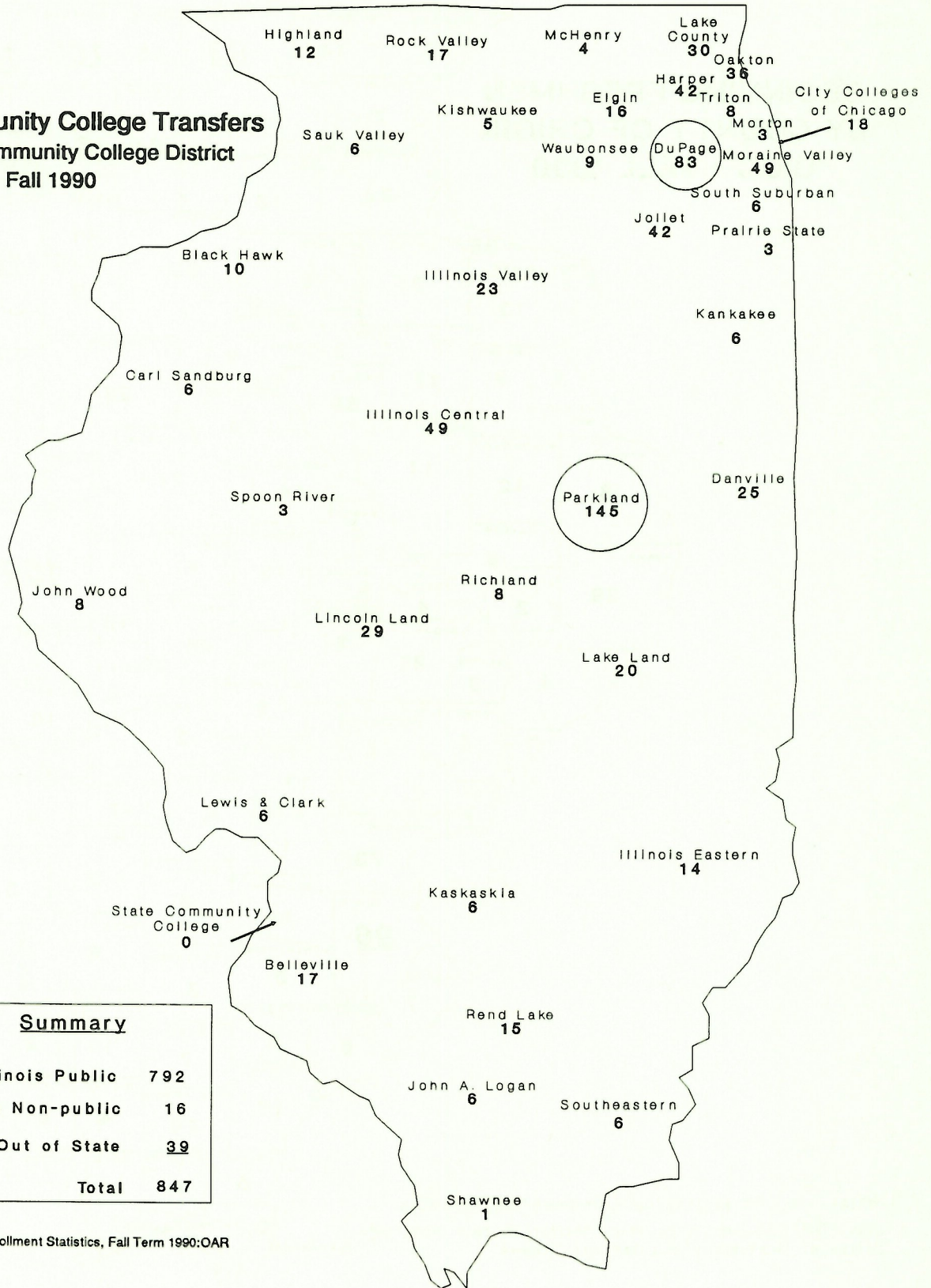

HIGHLIGHTS

1. *Beginning freshmen enrolled in the College of Commerce and Business Administration had the highest one-year retention rate, 97 percent. Overall, 94 percent of the freshman class was still enrolled on clear or probationary status after one year. One-year retention rates are reported in Table 39.*
2. *Table 40 tracks the mean grade point averages for community college transfers and four-year college transfers for six semesters after transfer. The community college transfer cohort dropped over one-half of a grade point the first semester but improved steadily in the three succeeding terms.*
3. *Graduation and retention patterns are reported in Tables 41 through 44 for beginning freshmen and transfers. The five-year graduation rate for freshmen ranges from 69 percent for the fall 1980 group to a high of 75 percent for the 1984 group. For transfers, the fall 1987 community college cohort had a 69 percent graduation rate after three years and the four-year group's rate was slightly lower at 68 percent.*

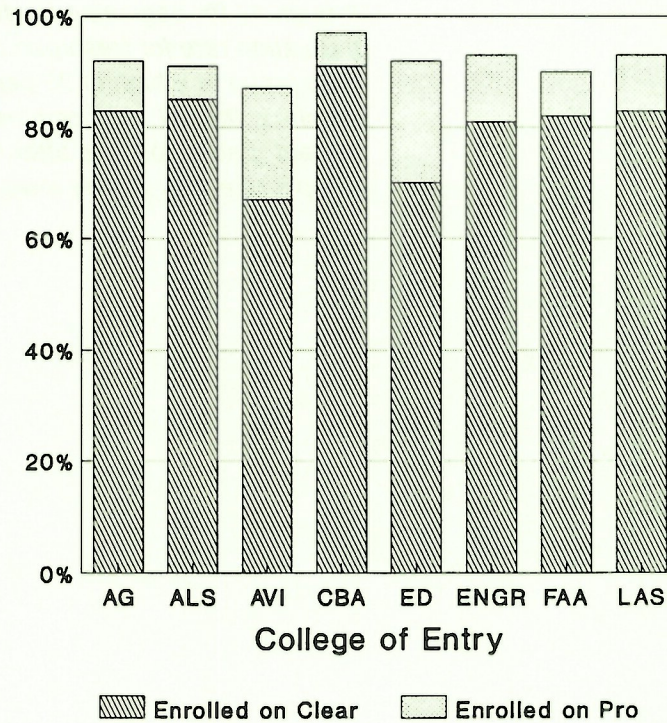

The above tables report enrollments and mean cumulative grade point averages for the fall 1987 cohort of new transfers to UIUC. This cohort was tracked for three years after transferring and represents the most recent cohort which has completed six semesters.

In fall 1987, 741 students from community colleges transferred to UIUC entering with a mean cumulative GPA of 4.26. After one semester, the mean GPA for this cohort dropped to 3.72. At the end of four semesters, or two years after transfer, the mean GPA for this cohort had increased to 3.97. Retention and graduation rates for this cohort are reported in Tables 43 and 44.

In fall 1987, 466 students from four-year colleges and universities transferred to UIUC entering with a mean cumulative GPA of 4.15. At the end of one semester, this cohort's mean GPA dropped to 3.86, a smaller decrease than experienced by the two-year cohort. At the end of four semesters, or two years after transfer, the mean GPA for this cohort increased to 4.08. Retention and graduation rates for this cohort are reported in Tables 43 and 44.

In fall 1987, 741 new students transferred from community colleges to UIUC. Of that initial cohort, 508 transfers graduated after six semesters representing a graduation rate of 69 percent. From four-year colleges, 466 new students transferred to UIUC. A slightly lower percentage of students in this cohort graduated, compared with the community college cohort. Of the 466 four-year transfers, 319 (68%) graduated after three years. Graduation rates for these two cohorts are similar to those reported for beginning freshmen in Table 41.

In fall 1987, 741 new students transferred from community colleges to UIUC. Of that cohort, 556 transfers graduated or were still enrolled after six semesters. From four-year colleges, 466 new students transferred to UIUC. A slightly higher percentage of students in this cohort than the community college cohort graduated or remained enrolled. Of the 466 four-year transfers, 365 (78%) graduated or were still enrolled after three years. Graduation rates for these two cohorts are reported in Table 43.

HIGHLIGHTS

1. *In FY 1990, the campus conferred 694 more degrees (+8%) than in FY 1984. The two professional programs, law and veterinary medicine, conferred fewer degrees in FY 1990 than in FY 1984. (Table 45).*
2. *According to the data presented in Table 46, only the Colleges of Agriculture and Commerce and Business Administration conferred substantially fewer degrees in FY 1990 than in FY 1984. The College of Agriculture conferred 141 fewer bachelor's degrees and the College of Commerce and Business Administration conferred 216 fewer degrees.*
3. *When comparing degrees conferred by gender, from FY 1984 to FY 1990, the campus has changed from a 58 percent male and 42 percent female composition to a 55 percent male and 45 percent female composition. The most notable disparity between degrees conferred for males and females is in the College of Engineering; however, this reflects the proportion of males to females enrolled in that college. (Table 47).*
4. *Tables 48 and 48.1 report undergraduate degrees conferred by race/ethnicity. When compared to FY1984, the percentage of undergraduate degrees conferred increased for Asian/Pacific Islanders (+3.5%), Blacks (+1.2%), and Hispanics (+0.8%).*

 From FY 1984 to FY 1990

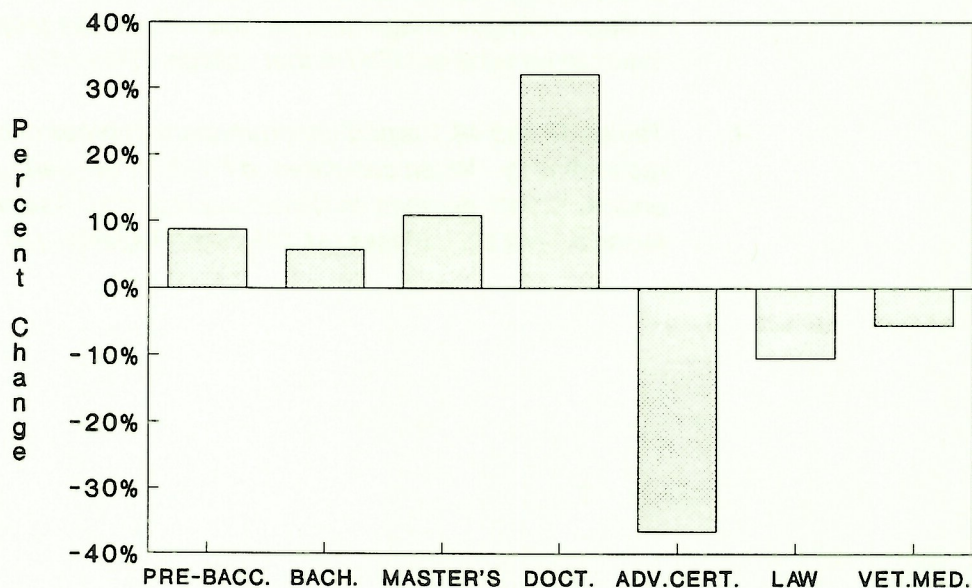

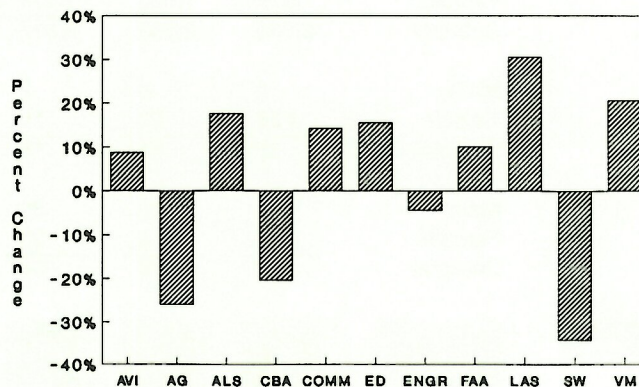
